

Prayer Service for Holy Thursday

Virtue Link: Faith, Hope, Love, Justice, Temperance, Fortitude

Catholic Character Themes: Community, Compassion, Discipleship, Reverence, Solidarity, Stewardship

INTRODUCTION

Holy Thursday begins what is known as the Easter Triduum: the three days celebrating events surrounding the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Holy Thursday liturgy invites us to enter more deeply the mystery of Christ's institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper: There at table with his friends, He gives Himself over to them under the appearance of bread and wine, a foretaste of when He will give Himself over to vanquish the power of sin and evil, rise to new life, and redeem the human race. The Gospel reading used in today's Eucharist is John's account of Christ washing His disciples' feet. This is the example we are to follow – what Henri Nouwen calls the “downward mobility” of service – Eucharist made visible in the witness of self-giving love.

OPENING SONG

OPENING PRAYER

Let us begin today's prayer with the sign of our faith: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Let us pray: Lord, as we prepare to enter the mystery of these three most holy days, we ask you to illumine our minds and hearts with the hope and promise of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. Give us eyes to see Him in the breaking of the bread and hearts that reach out to Him in service to one another. We ask you this through Christ our Lord. Amen

And now, let us listen to God's word.

READING

A reading from the Gospel of John (Jn 13, 1-12)

Before the feast of Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to pass from this world to the Father.

He loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end.

The devil had already induced Judas, son of Simon the Iscariot, to hand him over.

So, during supper,

fully aware that the Father had put everything into his power

and that he had come from God and was returning to God,

he rose from supper and took off his outer garments.

He took a towel and tied it around his waist.

Then he poured water into a basin

and began to wash the disciples' feet

and dry them with the towel around his waist.

He came to Simon Peter, who said to him,

"Master, are you going to wash my feet?"

Jesus answered and said to him,

"What I am doing, you do not understand now,

but you will understand later."

Peter said to him, "You will never wash my feet."

Jesus answered him,

"Unless I wash you, you will have no inheritance with me."

Simon Peter said to him,
"Master, then not only my feet, but my hands and head as well."
Jesus said to him,
"Whoever has bathed has no need except to have his feet washed,
for he is clean all over;
so you are clean, but not all."
For he knew who would betray him;
for this reason, he said, "Not all of you are clean."

So when he had washed their feet
and put his garments back on and reclined at table again,
he said to them, "Do you realize what I have done for you?
You call me 'teacher' and 'master,' and rightly so, for indeed I am.
If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet,
you ought to wash one another's feet.
I have given you a model to follow,
so that as I have done for you, you should also do."
